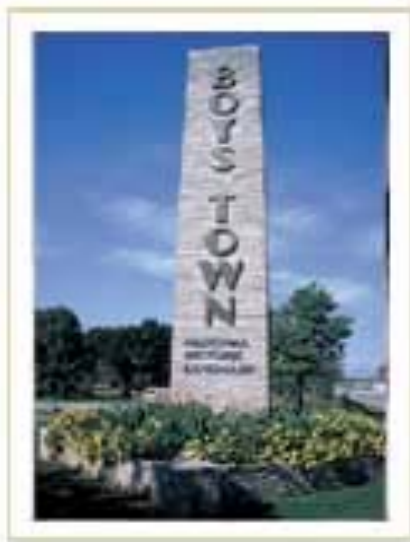

When people think of Father Flanagan's Girls and Boys Town, many think of the national organization in Nebraska, or the Academy Award-winning movie starring Spencer Tracy and Mickey Rooney.



We also want you to know that Father Flanagan's dream is very much alive right here in Southern California. We annually provide direct care, treatment and assistance to 1,333 children and 269 families, and indirect care to an additional 59,907 individuals through various programs. The need for our life-saving help is even greater than when Father Flanagan began to make his dream a reality in 1917.

In California, over 1,900,500 children under 18 live in poverty. More than 190,000 children are not in school and not working. These are reported statistics alone. There are thousands of other children and families struggling. That is why your support and partnership are even more important today.

Many of the children Girls and Boys Town cares for today have no love or support in their lives. They do not see a future for themselves. Instead, they see abuse, abandonment and neglect. They are hurt, angry and hopeless. They choose gangs as their families, or drugs and alcohol to deaden their pain.

Girls and Boys Town of Southern California is working with children and families right here in Los Angeles and Orange Counties. And we are making a difference!

The Original Father Flanagan's Boys' Home



SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

Emergency Short-Term Shelters and Assessment Centers provide a safe environment for girls and boys in crisis, including runaway, homeless, court-placed or abused children. Highly trained staff provide intensive support to help children (ages 11-17) be safe, work towards achieving individual treatment goals, learn life skills and problem solving techniques, identify challenges and make better choices. On average, children stay in our short-term facilities about one month. Emphasis is placed on family reunification if it is in the best interests of the child.

The Long Beach Emergency Shelter and Assessment Center opened in June 1993 and helps up to 16 boys at one time, 300 per year. Our **Price Family Campus** began serving children in February 1998 through a donation from David and Dallas Price of American Golf Corporation. The facility, located in the historic West Adams District of Los Angeles, is able to provide care for 14 girls at one time, up to 250 annually.



Trabuco Canyon Residential Services at Girls and Boys Town of Southern California care for children (ages 11 – 17) in four long-term residential homes each staffed by a husband and wife couple referred to as Family Teachers. The homes are located on 80 acres in Trabuco Canyon in Orange County. Two homes for girls and two homes for boys opened in 1994. More than 55 children are helped each year, and stay with us for an average of 12 months.

Tilly's Baby Home - The fifth home on the Trabuco Canyon campus houses our youngest children, ages 0-6. The home opened in 2005 due to the generous support of *Tilly's*. This unique family-style environment cares for sibling sets removed from their homes due to abuse, abandonment or neglect, who otherwise might be separated from each other.

Family Based Services including Family Preservation Services and Family Centered Services, provide trained consultants to help families whose children are at-risk for removal from their homes due to abuse or neglect. More than 260 families are served each year; and, 90% of the families who enter Family Based Services successfully complete our program.
